ACADEMIC & CAREER PLANNING

Academic and Career Planning (ACP) is a student-driven, adult-supported process designed to help students create their own unique vision for post-secondary success. As each student navigates through this process they will explore many different academic and career possibilities.

BUZZ WORDS

ACADEMIC CAREER PLANNING (ACP)

A process to equip students and families with the tools necessary to make more informed choices about post-secondary education, training, and careers for life after high school.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP)

A high school course that could potentially offer college credit if a successful test score is obtained.

ADVANCED STANDING (AS)

Allows students to request college credit for successfully completed (AS) high school courses if attending a specific technical college.

EARLY COLLEGE CREDIT PROGRAM (ECCP)

ECCP allows qualified juniors and seniors the opportunity to attend a post-secondary university for the purpose of taking courses that will earn them both college and high school credit.

POST-SECONDARY

Any education beyond high school.

SOFT SKILLS

Also known as "people skills" are how you relate to others. Some examples are: communication, flexibility, leadership, motivation and patience.

START COLLEGE NOW (SCN)

SCN allows qualified juniors and seniors the opportunity to attend a post-secondary technical college for the purpose of taking courses that will earn them both college and high school credit.

XELLO

Xello is an internet-based career exploration planning tool used by our students to explore career and college options and to develop a career plan. Xello can be accessed from school, home or wherever a student has access to the internet.

Features of the program:

***Internet Surveys:** World renowned assessment tools to help students identify their career interests, skills, abilities, and learning styles

***Career Profile:** Thorough and up-to-date information about hundreds of different occupations, including direct links between careers and related college programs.

***Multimedia Interviews:** Interviews with real people in each occupation, which add depth and realism to career profiles.

***College and Financial Aid Information:**

Comprehensive college and financial aid information, with a number of useful search tools to help students find the right college and the right scholarships.

***Employment Guide:** Advice for all ages of the job search process, including developing a job search plan, networking, writing a resume and cover letter, preparing for interviews and adjusting to a new job.

***My Plan:** An online portfolio where students can develop and reflect on his or her academic, personal, and career exploration activities and make plans for the future.

***Resume Builder:** Integrated with the My Plan tool to help students create, format, and print professional looking resumes quickly and easily.

***Parent Portal:** Allows parents to view the information their child has stored.



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BUZZ WORDS (Continued)

CAREER COUNSELING

A process that will help students to know and understand themselves and the world of work in order to make career, educational, and life decisions.

CHARACTER EDUCATION

The proactive effort by schools to instill in students important core, ethical and performance character traits such as courage, cooperation, honesty, compassion, responsibility, and respect for self and others.

FREE APPLICATION for FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA)

A form that can be prepared annually by current and prospective college students (undergraduate and graduate) to determine their eligibility for student financial aid.

SERVICE LEARNING

A teaching and learning strategy that integrates meaningful community service with instruction and reflection to enrich the learning experience, teach civic responsibility and strengthen communities.

STEM

A curriculum based on the idea of educating students in four specific areas: Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math

XELLO

An internet-based career exploration and planning tool used by our students to explore career and college options and develop a career plan.

YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP (YA)

A program designed for high school students who want hands-on learning in an occupation area at a worksite along with classroom instruction.
